
THE PRESBYTERIAN HYMNAL

The new Presbyterian hymnal work began in 2008 and went to print in August, 2013. Our session put in an order for 150 books early and received free shipping and a significant discount. The hymnals are here and ready to be used in worship. They may be purchased for \$15 in honor or memory of a loved one; a book plate will be attached. Multiple purchases may be made.

The new hymnal is organized according to the history of salvation, beginning with creation and finishing with the Church's hope for the Lord's return. "Holy, Holy, Holy! Lord God Almighty" will be the first hymn. There are 850 hymns along with liturgical material drawn from the Presbyterian Book of Common

worship. Included are older hymns that have never been published in a Presbyterian hymnal, such as, "Softly and Tenderly," "Rock of Ages," "Leaning on the Everlasting Arms." Spirituals, such as "Soon and Very Soon," contemporary praise songs, global music from six continents and psalms will all be available. Displays of the hymnals are placed around the building for your inspection. The Worship Committee is excited

to have them in the pews soon.





Fall Back! Run Away! Withdraw!

My father used to ask why it was that churches always went on a "retreat" and never on an "advance." I never had an answer for him.

Your Session recently went on an annual RETREAT and it proved to be a very productive day, indeed. We opened our time together, as we always do, with worship and devotion for our Triune God. We spent some time in the *Presbyterian (USA) Book of Order* and some of your Ruling Elders found out that I don't make up this stuff, it's *in the book!* And there's something very reassuring about that, because it means that we don't have to re-invent things, they're already outlined and we can move on to think and plan and imagine much better things we want to do. We also learned that, although the denomination outlines what all Presbyterian (USA) churches are expected to do, it leaves most decisions open to the creativity and unique choice of each individual Presbyterian church.

We spent some time learning about leadership – especially leadership of volunteers. We challenged one another to broaden committee work, and to consider new or expanded ministries throughout 2014. And we spent some time dreaming together about fresh, different, creative ways to serve God, you, and our neighbors.

We also went on a *mini field-trip* when we traveled to see Jane and Tolly Dill. It was a wonderful experience to see them both, and to know that Jane is getting stronger. We gave her a long-overdue gift in thanks for her service to this church as a Ruling Elder. Jane was *Chair* of the Worship Committee for two years, while she simultaneously served on Christian Ed, Outreach, and the Scholarship Committees, too. We learned quite early that although Jane Dill meets us with a sweet spirit, she's also pretty savvy about getting things accomplished.

The most important thing we did together all day, happened at the very end of our time together. Although we had stayed a little longer than our agenda outlined, and I gave your Ruling Elders the option of staying longer *still,* or quitting for the day, they chose to stay together and to celebrate communion at the Lord's Table. When we come together at Table, when we serve each other using God's common elements, when we pray in one voice, the Spirit of God is palpable. And your Ruling Elders wanted to worship together as Christ's servants.

I hope you'll get involved and serve with them in interesting ways this year. I also hope you will pray for them often. Your Ruling Elders have been called by God through the voice of this congregation. Your Session is awe-some!

First Presbyterian Church, Henderson Receives

"Go Green" Award

The Henderson church was named winner of the *"Go Green"* Award in December for its energy-saving and eco-friendly changes. The award was co-sponsored by the *Keep Henderson Beautiful* committee and the Henderson Chamber of Commerce. It's the first time this recognition has been given to a church.

Here at FPC, our "business" is God's business and the Christian Education Team decided to educate the congregation about one of the Essential Tenets of the Presbyterian Faith: Stewardship of Creation. The team wanted to raise awareness and to gently educate members about the responsibilities of caring for creation. The concept of producing a theological and humorous video was born. The choir director wrote new lyrics to *Bringing in the Sheaves* and called it *Let the Church Go Green*. The video may be viewed online at **Let Our Church Go Green - YouTube**

As a result of the video, Henderson has begun a recycling program for aluminum cans, plastic bottles, and paper. There are recycle containers around the church, even one outside the sanctuary to recycle Sunday bulletins. We are replacing incandescent light bulbs with fluorescent ones, using recycled copy paper, and eliminating foam cups and plates in the church. We mulch flower beds to conserve watering. We raise thermostats, turn on ceiling fans and adhere to a strict schedule of changing filters on heating and cooling units. We partition off parts of the building when not in use, have installed double paned windows, energy efficient light switches that automatically turn off lights, added energy conserving LED lights, water efficient plumbing fixtures, and new ceiling fans. We put a small snippet about environmentalism in the church newsletter each month to encourage members to "Go Green" at home.

When asked to quantify our success, here's what we discovered: we have saved 1146 styrofoam cups and 500 styrofoam plates from the landfill each year. Energy efficient commodes save water. The old ones used 3.5 gallons per use and our new ones use 1.6 gallons. An electric bill from March 2010 was compared to the same bill in March 2013 and it revealed metered usage decreased from 2471 KWH to 1714 KWH. Until the city introduces curb-side recycling, the Christian Education team members continue to take the recycling sacks to the local center monthly.

We are proud of the work that the C.E. team introduced and the changes we've made for God's world. We encourage other churches to join our work!



As you all know, our world is becoming smaller through technology. It is amazing that we can instantly be in contact with someone across town or across the world. It is very important for us to let current members, family and friends know what is going on at our church.

Because of how things are changing we have created a new committee, Communications. I am the chairperson and, with the help of Kathy Porter (co-chair) and Judy Andrasko, we are going to make sure we are doing what we can to stay up to date. Some of our duties will cover our website, facebook, the Pipeline, & our Phone Tree.

You will be hearing more from us in the near future. We want to make sure we have everyone's current phone number and email address. We would also like to hear from you. 


- Heard a report from Personnel that Mary Tidwell had completed her trial period satisfactorily and had been hired permanently
