THE STRIPPING OF SACRED SPACE The final act of this service of worship and reflection is the stripping of the worship space. The unadorned space reflects Jesus' abandonment during the night in Gethsemane, and now gives a depiction of Christ's desolation. No benediction will be given, nor any postlude played on this night, as the services for Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday are actually one unified ritual. Symbolically, Christ, stripped of his power and glory, is now in the hands of his captors.
