on May 13th that more than 40 percent of



bee hives died in the past year. Since April 2014 beekeepers lost 42.1 percent of their colonies according to an annual survey conducted by a bee partnership that includes the U.S. Department of Agriculture.

Lowe's plans to stop selling pesticides linked to the massive decline of honeybees around the world. Lowe's announced in April of this year that it would phase out products containing neonic pesticides over the next four years. Neonicotinoids have been linked in multiple studies to the deaths of birds, bees, and other animals. In April the EPA also announced that it would stop issuing new permits to use the pesticides. Home Depot announced last summer that it would label plants treated with neonicotinoids. We have a bee to thank for every one in three bites of food we eat. Let's research our pesticides and help protect the honey bees!
