#### **DID YOU KNOW?**



#### **DURING THIS TIME OF TRANSITION**

Since the pastor's announcement of taking another call and her final Sunday in our pulpit, the church has moved into a time of transition. True, it is a time of sweet sorrow. We have gone through the process of saying goodbye—we have honored her with farewell gifts and celebrations, thanked her with personal tributes and remembrances, and rejoiced (some) with her as she moves into another area of life and ministry. She will continue to be in our hearts and in our prayers as well.

What comes next? The Presbyterian Church is a connectional church and there is a process for searching for another minister—decently and in order. The Committee on Ministry of Grace Presbytery has appointed a liaison from that committee—Jerry Camp—who belongs to First Presbyterian Church of Kilgore and who will meet with the session on February 16 to give the session an overview of the entire call process and discuss the options for transitional leadership. The COM has selected Rev. Nick Setzer from St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church to Moderate our session until a pastor has been called.

A few thoughts gleaned from reading about other churches during transition:

- 1. God will be with us during this time. Pastors will come and go. Only God will never leave us. (Hebrews 13:5)
- 2. God is in control. (Eph.1:11). This pastoral transition is not happening outside the will of God.
- 3. God has a good plan for this transition. It might not feel good right now. But he works all things for the good of his people. (Romans 8:28)
- 4. It is o.k. to weep. While good will come out of this pastoral transition, that doesn't remove the sadness. Losing our pastor hurts. The Ephesians elders wept when Paul said goodbye. (Acts 20:36-38.). They knew God would be with them and that he would bring good out of the transition. Nevertheless, they wept. It's o.k.to weep. It's a way of saying thank you to both God and our pastor.
- 5. FPC and its ministry must go on. The Great Commission did not say, "Go therefore and make disciples...if you have a pastor." Will it be a bit harder without a pastor leading? Probably. But God and the pastor worked to equip us in the ministry. (Ephesians 4:11-12)
- 6. We must stay bound together in unity and love during this transition. This will be a season of testing. We didn't ask for it. But with God's help we will endure.

#### FPC-HENDERSON REPRESENTATIVES TO WORK WITH MCALLEN MISSION TEAM

Bienvenidos or Welcome! That begins the experience for asylum seekers coming to the Sacred Heart Humanitarian Respite Center (SHHRC) in McAllen, Texas. Several members of our FPC-Henderson congregation will be joining these efforts during a Mission Trip to McAllen March 19-24, 2017. Led by John Tieken, the team right now consist of: Bert Lowe, Kathy Porter, Lynn Tieken and Claudia Morgan-Gray. So come vicariously walk with us through a moment in time at the SHHRC in McAllen. We have more room for more volunteers to travel with us and, as always, prayers for this project accepted and appreciated. So let's see what this journey will be like:

Asylum seekers are dropped off at the bus station and volunteers transport them by van to the Sacred Heart Church. For almost three years, the parish hall at Sacred Heart has been a place of respite for people seeking protection in the US from the violence in their Central American home countries of Guatemala, Honduras and El Salvador.

As with those who have come and volunteered before us, we will be hosted at the Presbyterian Disaster Assistance Hosting Site at First Presbyterian Church of McAllen – whose hospitality is warm and welcoming for us and the Asylum seekers who are now "guests." Bedding is provided and there is an elevator. An equipped kitchen is available so we can cook our own meals, if desired, or eat at local restaurants. The church houses a preschool, so our days will be up and out by 8:15 am. So our time begins:

On Monday, a brief orientation to the space and the expectations for the work we will do. From the words of a group that was there, as the first group of guests arrive and enter the hall, the volunteers all stop what they are doing and clap and shout "Bienvenidos! Welcome!" The guests enter looking somewhat fearful and concerned, but with the cheering welcome, their body language changes. They look around and smile. There is a welcoming energy that tells them this is a safe place and these are good people.

Their time begins with registration where they receive instructions about getting to their destination. The next station is where they are greeted by a volunteer and receive a backpack with hygiene supplies, such as toothbrush and toothpaste, combs, deodorant, and diapers and other supplies for children. Volunteers engage them to help them get settled at a table for a meal, followed by a shower and clean clothes (provided through donations). Some arrive with only an hour before their bus leaves, while others may be there for several days. When the families gather to return to the bus station, they are given instructions on how to manage the bus trip and a brown manila envelope containing their immigration documents and bus tickets. On the envelope is a list of the bus stations they will pass through and a note that says, "I do not speak English. Please help me." One can't help but wonder what kind of help they find as they pass through their journey stops. As they leave the center, each family is also given a bag of food for the journey.

Join us in next month's Pipeline for the "rest of the story."

Our congregation also gifted twenty men at Rusk State Hospital through our Angel tree outreach. Lynn and John unselfishly delivered our gift bags prior to the Christmas weekend. Thank you, FPC members, for doing our Lord's work for so many in need.

Outreach is ongoing.

brain-power and talents and join our Committee. Please sign the Communications sheet in the narthex. We need some of the communicative people of this congregation to help us. We promise fun and challenges!




