The people may be seated.

STRIPPING OF THE CHURCH

All linens, paraments, and communion vessels are removed from the worship space. The hymn will end and we will sit in silence. The stripping is the church's sorrow over Christ's death, the paring down of the self in order to receive the life of Christ, the final stripping away of our own life before death.

After the stripping of the church, all depart in silence.

There is no benediction. Worship continues on Good Friday.

A Note on Maundy Thursday

Maundy Thursday (from *mandatum*, Latin for commandment) proclaims Jesus' new commandment to love one another as he has loved us. It celebrates Christ's example of humble service and self-offering, represented by the washing of feet and the sharing of communion. The liturgy begins with an emphasis on confession and forgiveness, concluding the penitential season of Lent. It ends with the stripping of the church in preparation for worship on Good Friday. – *The Book of Common Worship*, 2018



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The Great Three Days: Holy Thursday

Maundy Thursday April 18, 2019

The liturgy of the Three Days declares one story in three parts. The worship services on Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter are best understood as three parts of one service, beginning on Thursday and ending on Easter. Together they are a transforming event as we explore the holy mystery that is God's saving love.

Worship begins.

Gathering

Jesus said: So if I, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also ought to wash one another's feet. For I have set you an example, that you also should do as I have done to you.
