Hello Saints!

VBS was a fun and wonderful time that we shared with our friends at First Christian Church. We had 20 children in our halls experiencing God's love through the story of Moses and the exodus. What a tremendous privilege it is to have the time and the resources for VBS. Special thanks to all who made it possible.

In our Seeker's class, we are reading Brueggemann's *Sabbath as Resistance*. In it he describes how God's command to honor the Sabbath by observing a day of rest has become estranged from modern society. In order to rediscover Sabbath rest, we have to take countercultural measures that declare ourselves as those who put God, other people, and life above all other priorities.

When I read this poem, it also reminded me of how easy it is to find our lives out of balance. Wendell Berry describes giving with no return, loving the undeserving and planting sequoias. None of these things provide instant or even short term gratification, but they do recognize that we are part of something much greater than ourselves. They recognize that we exist as creatures in God's world.

Perhaps it will speak to your heart, too.

Ask yourself: Will this satisfy a woman satisfied to bear a child? Will this disturb the sleep of a woman near to giving birth?

As soon as the generals and the politicos can predict the motions of your mind, lose it. Leave it as a sign to mark the false trail, the way you didn't go.

Be like the fox who makes more tracks than necessary, some in the wrong direction. Practice resurrection.

First-known minister of Gun Violence Prevention ordained July 7, 2019

On July 7, 2019 the Rev. Deanna Hollas became the first-known minister of Gun Violence Prevention following a service held at her home church in Dallas. Sponsored by Grace Presbytery, her service of ordination was held at Westminster Presbyterian Church in Dallas. The ordination service was presided over by Rev. David Schaefers, the Moderator of Grace Presbytery. Rev. Clay Brantley preached for the service and said "In the last 100 days, 10,000 Americans have died from gun violence and 22,000



have been injured. Deanna's call is a sign of the great persistence and wisdom of God." In her new call, Hollas will serve as the Coordinator of Gun Violence Prevention Ministries of Presbyterian Peace Fellowship, serving a network of over 800 local Presbyterian gun violence prevention advocates in all 50 states. "With all the gun violence in our country, it is easy to lose hope and ask: where is God? But I am hopeful," Hollas said. "I see God raising up so many people and churches to study and speak out and work towards ending the violence that is plaguing our nation. Change is coming."

On July 28, Rev. Hollas was featured in a powerful interview with the *New York Times*. "The saying 'thoughts and prayers' has been co-opted by the gun lobby to keep the church from taking action so they can increase their profits," Rev. Hollas said in an interview. "While all that we do as Christians should be rooted in worship and prayer, it should not stay there. It is like breathing—worship and prayer is the in-breath, and action is the out-breath."

Rev. Hollas will hold a webinar for people of faith who want to engage in conversations and action to prevent gun violence on Tuesday, August 13 at 12:00 noon EST. For more information please go to presbypeacefellowship.org.



































Reminder

Sales Tax Holiday Tax Free Weekend: August 9-11, 2019

Texas shoppers get a break from state and local sales taxes on August 9, 10, and 11. The law exempts most clothing, footwear, school supplies and backpacks priced under \$100 from sales and use taxes, which could save shoppers about \$8 on every \$100 they spend.
