What is the first thing that comes to mind when you think of the Christmas Season?

Is it the iconic tree? Or the colors red and green and gold? Is it shepherds and angels? Perhaps it is the weather, or the frequent re-runs of "National Lampoon's Christmas Vacation" or "A Christmas Story". It might be more personal, like gatherings of family and friends. Maybe Christmas is a time of shopping, getting caught up in Black Friday, Small Business Saturday, Cyber Monday or Giving Tuesday.

Amid the decorations, festivities and gift exchanges it can be easy to lose focus on why we celebrate Christmas at all. We are remembering the birth of Jesus Christ!

The four weeks of Advent, the weeks between Thanksgiving and Christmas, can be a time of renewed hope and joy. If we allow ourselves to be caught up in the mystery of the incarnation, Christmas can be a deeply spiritual time of the year.

When Christ was born, our eternal God became part of human history. The miracle of incarnation deserves pondering. Perhaps this Christmas we can make room - in our busyness and in our hearts - to sit in thankful wonder for the greatest gift ever given.

What if we were to look forward to the birth of Jesus with the same anticipation of a young child longing to unwrap presents under the tree? What if we brought that sense of joyful yearning into our relationship with our Creator?

Each week in Advent, we light one more candle on the wreath, symbolizing the light of God becoming stronger in the presence of humanity. On Christmas, we light the Christ candle as we commemorate the arrival of the infant Jesus.

To tap into these feelings more acutely, it might help to set aside quiet reflection time. An Advent study, like the one the Sunday school groups are doing, may inspire us to stay connected to the greater Love that motivates us to give. Or, try lighting a personal advent wreath on your dinner table or during prayer time.

Being recipients of God's generous grace and love can indeed motivate us to pass that love along.

Giving that is thoughtful and motivated is the best kind.

Enjoy this Advent season in hopeful anticipation of Christmas. Reflect on what it means that Jesus Christ is Emmanuel, and celebrate the greatest gift of all: God is with us! Merry Christmas!





Did you know that SWEPCO has plans for more clean energy ahead, for improving the environment and saving customers money?

December 2019

SWEPCO plans to add 810 megawatts of wind energy by 2022 to bring cleaner, affordable energy to its customers. SWEPCO filed applications with the Arkansas, Louisiana, and Texas utility commissions on July 15, 2019, and expects decisions in 2020.

SWEPCO's long-term plan calls for more than one-third of the energy required by customers to be generated from wind and solar sources over the next 20 years.

Under this plan for SWEPCO's energy source mix:

- Wind energy increases from 9% to 26%, and solar is introduced and grows to 10%
- Natural gas grows from 7% to 19%
- Coal drops from 83% to 44%

Toward its goal, SWEPCO is proposing to add 810 MW of wind energy:

- Enough wind energy to power 200,000 homes
- Save customers an estimated \$2 billion over the 30-year expected life of the wind facilities
- Further diversify SWEPCO energy source mix 810 MW moves wind to 21% of the mix
- Help customers meet their own renewable energy and sustainability goals
