Follow That Star: Christmas in July Edition

The star which they had observed at its rising went ahead of them until it came to a standstill over the place where the child lay. Matthew 2:9

We have arrived at the midway point: it is July in the year 2020. Unsettling things are all around us, but good things are happening too. SpaceX, a private company, partnered with NASA, a government agency, to send astronauts into space. Hooray for teamwork and reusable rockets! Black Lives Matter has found a foothold for change. Meaningful progress is being articulated in new ways. Conversations are happening, allowing more people to understand generations-old scars left by racism and bigotry. Our lives look different than they did just six months before.

In January, to mark the epiphany, each of you was given a Star Word. As the Magi followed the star to greet the newborn Jesus, we were invited to follow our word to whatever epiphanies it might illuminate for us in 2020. How has the first half of your star-following journey shaped your year? Are you seeing the world differently? Are you hearing your word, or versions of it in surprising places? Perhaps your word was "joy." If you haven't experienced joy lately, where can you find more joy, in your memories, in nature, in the psalms? If your word was "solitude" perhaps you have had enough solitude, and are looking for ways to counter-balance your word in your life with phone calls and socially distanced visits.

Have you shared your word with a friend? How do your two words and your experiences with them compare? Perhaps, your friend can point out instances of and reflections on your word that you have yet to notice.

My word is RENEW. Over and over this year in scriptures, the possibility for transformation (renewal) by the Spirit has held my attention. I am also noticing how I bend my Star Word, sometimes toward refresh, like spring cleaning, sometimes toward revive, especially when I seek new energy for a routine task. I like the part of renew that suggests again, or repeat. It has a repurpose, second-life or even a start over quality that the world does not always value.

Whatever your word, whatever your journey, enjoy it. You still have six more months to play with it. May it bring you closer to our Gracious God.

For the first time, PC(USA) held its General Assembly virtually. To say that this General Assembly is unlike anything we've seen before may be an understatement. But, "from lament to hope" is where we are - and all of us with each other.

We are living in unprecedented times – as individuals and as a country we are aching. We mourn the more than 100,000 American lives lost to the Covid-19 virus. Virtual Worship continues to be our primary source for community gathering, worship and prayer as the risk of transmitting the Covid-19 virus remains high in our region.

Please continue to enjoy Rev. Michele's service online on the First Presbyterian, Henderson, TX, Facebook page, on Sunday morning at 11 am, Music in the Middle with Joshua each Wednesday evening at 6 pm, and Rev. Michele's check-in on Thursdays. If you miss the actual time, the programs can still be viewed or reviewed at your convenience. They are that good!!

We encourage everyone to develop a special area (worship space) using symbols such as a cross or a candle. Make the time and space as meaningful as possible. Use a quiet space outside for meditation and prayer. Have candles, bible and devotionals arranged in a quiet corner of a room inside your home. Centering prayers help us to slow our thoughts and listen for God's input. Begin your meditation with words like "Come, Holy Spirit! Open my heart" or "Lord, you are my refuge" Or simply, a breath prayer, as our pastor has mentioned recently. "Lord, I inhale your peace" (breathing in) and "I exhale my anxiety" (breathing out). Concentrate on God. Relax. See what happens. Pray earnestly for those you love. Let the Lord guide you. Let's pray that God's will be done and mountains may be moved. With God, all things are possible.

We all look forward to worshipping again in the sanctuary. The Worship Committee will be meeting soon to discern the best way to follow recommendations from the Covid-19 Task Force and the Session. A highly modified service may soon be possible in the sanctuary, or we may meet for devotions in the park. Either way, we will be conscious of social distancing and follow precautions for minimal spreading of the virus.

The Outreach Committee is communicating among members, however, we have not met via conference or in person. We do hope to have another Zoom conference call meeting in July – that date is still pending.

As we have noted before, just because we are not meeting in person does not mean that the work and blessings of our congregation do not continue. They indeed continue. One of the programs that we as individuals and as a church have help shepherd over many years is the Yates Park Help the Youth program that Betty Elder helped champion over 35 years ago. This coming school year is going to be challenging on many levels but this important program is going to continue to make the challenge less challenging for many. Because of the Covid virus, school will be starting early this year – on August 5th. Therefore, this school supplies project will also be held earlier than normal. As we have always done, FPC rises to the occasion to help students through this project. We are beginning our school supplies drive now and will run it through the month of July. You may donate money through the church by making your check out to FPC but noting on it in the Memo line "Yates Park School Supply Project" or you may purchase school supplies yourself and either get them to the church or call one of us to come pick them up. However and whatever you are able to help with this project is greatly appreciated. Remember to get your donations of money and/or supplies to us by July 31st. Thank you.

As we did in May, we do plan to continue in a safe and social distancing kind of way checking in with and on our neighbors through our Adopt A Block walk. We have tentatively set July 20th as our next AAB. If you would like to join us for an hour of walking, exercise, sweat, fellowship, and rewarding reception of our neighbors – Save the date and join us.

Thank you to all that contributed to our second Special Offering – Pentecost. Because of the generosity of this congregation, we raised \$390.00 for the Pentecost Offering. This special offering goes directly to helping children in need and young adults in their faith journeys. FPC Henderson gets to keep 40% of our total offering and this year it looks like it will be around \$156.00 that we will devote to an organization devoted to helping children.

We also continue to ask for your blessings and assistance for the HIM ministry – it is needed and greatly appreciated.
