The government should leave health care decisions to the private consultation of the patient and the doctor. Out of fear of persecution and punishment, many healthcare providers that specialize in women's care have already locked their doors leaving women with absolutely no healthcare of any kind.



As we watch several states move swiftly to apply rigid limitations and punitive laws to abortion seekers and providers, it becomes clear that this is not about the sovereignty of life.

As people of faith, we are called to support one another against systemic oppression. As is the pattern with most forms of oppression, this decision will *most severely* impact persons who are already marginalized by lower economic status and lack of social support.

We are called to act. Write the letters, call the officials, send the emails, and let the decision makers know how their constituents really feel.

In the meantime, we can cling to the promise that God is with us, moving the world ever closer to justice and peace. We may not yet see the rainbow, but we will see the dove and the return of dry land. Keep moving forward with love.
