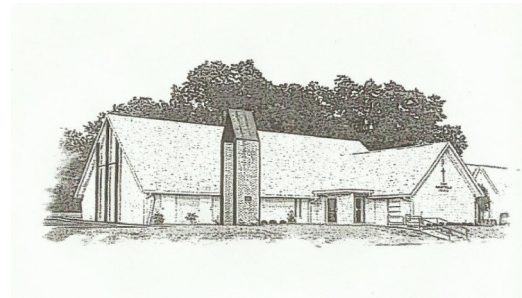

Watching the Wrens

One of the rituals of spending the night at Grandma Ruby's house when I was young was waking up early to sit on the porch and listen to the birds. The porch was fully screened and provided an unobstructed view of the large open back yard. A climbing rose bush made a bit of camouflage on the side and if I sat still, the birds would even alight on the trellis. Some of our birdwatching focused on the wren house that hung in the apple tree.


Each spring, my Papaw would bring the little white bird house out of the basement where it has been carefully stored for the winter. It would be hung in the same place and the wrens would come back every year. We would watch them busily build the nest. Over the summer, the hatchlings would grow and learn to fly. Then the little wren family would fly away for another season.

Papaw would take down the little house and look it over on his workshop table before storing it for the winter. Sometimes the paint was touched up or the shingle on the roof was replaced. Any remaining elements from the nest were removed and then it was put away until spring. One year, my Grandma had a scrap length of yarn that she thought would make a nice, soft addition to the nest. She placed it in the house before it was hung in the tree. And then she waited. That spring, when the wrens came back, they spent the better part of a morning working that length of yarn out of their house. With the unwanted yarn out of the way, the house was finally "move-in ready" and the tiny birds got busy bringing in the sticks and bits they wanted for their nest.

Those quiet porch mornings with Grandma and the birds were special. I thank God for those little rituals.



After distributing ice cold watermelon to our neighbors, the Outreach and Fellowship Committees enjoyed some fellowship and cool watermelon.

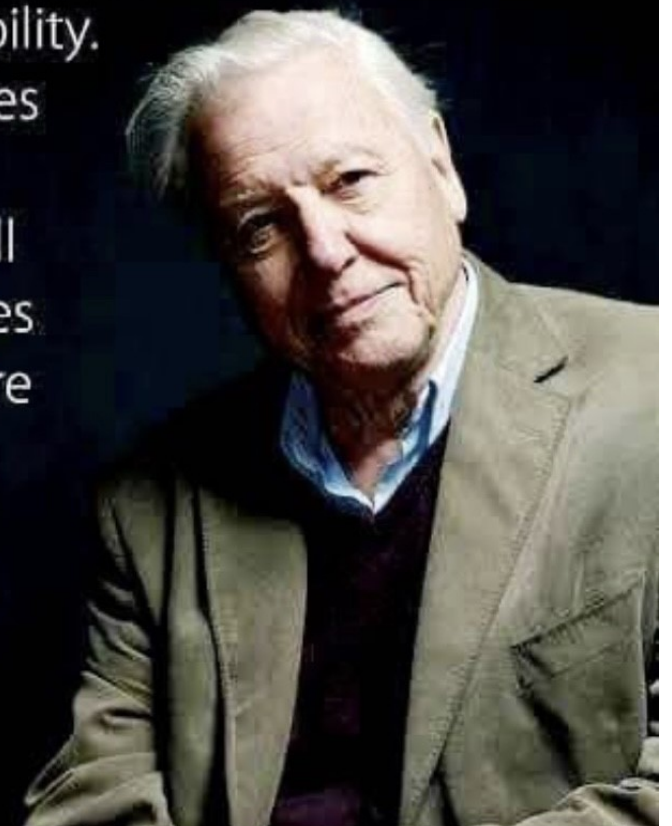

Make sure you check the filters in your house regularly as well.

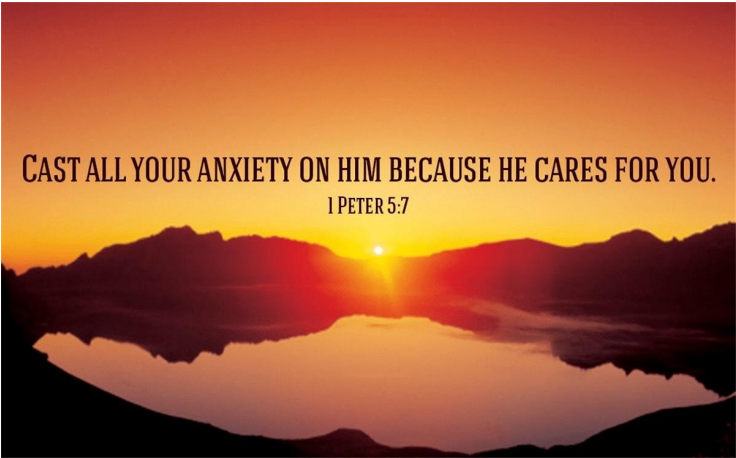
