The sign-up sheets will be in the narthex for sponsoring a basket at \$10.00 per basket. For those not coming into the church for service but want to participate in this special project, please contact Lynn or Claudia. We will be completing this project the first week of November so that H.I.M. has the time to put the baskets together for distribution beginning the second week of November. Please keep this deadline in mind when participating with us.

FPC-Henderson is deeply involved with Henderson Interchurch Ministry (H.I.M.) and has been since its conception. Remembering this connection, our team plans to continue our emphasis on giving to H.I.M. throughout the remainder of 2022 – including a Christmastime giving option. We'll share more on that later.

Our other "around the corner" outreach mission includes our **Adopt-A-Block program**. We walk and visit with neighbors around our church on a regular basis. Our next Adopt-A-Block will be Monday, October 17th and again on December 12th. We meet at 4 pm – if you'd like to join us – come on!

After reviewing our church's finances through the first eight months of 2022, it was noted that both our pledges and plate are running below budget as well as our expenses.

The committee reviewed the church's insurance coverage for the period September 19, 2022, to September 19, 2023. It was noted that our insurance with Church Mutual went up \$333. After discussion, the committee voted to accept their insurance bid.

The committee discussed this year's stewardship campaign including a timetable of events. It was determined to mail our stewardship letter with the 2023 pledge cards on October 10<sup>th</sup> and request them to be returned to the church by October 23, 2022. The cards will be dedicated on Sunday, October 30, 2022. Also, a member of our committee will do a minute for stewardship each Sunday during this time. Finally, the committee decided to have a catered lunch on November 20<sup>th</sup>.
