

Take Time to Play, Everyday

Did you know that playing is an essential part of life? Beyond the play we experience as children, when our lives are provisioned by grown ups and we are too young to carry the weight of responsibility, play has an important part in our lives.

God is known to play in the bible and encourages us to play, too.

In the scriptures, there is evidence of God's playful spirit. Often, God's people are found dancing. In Ecclesiastes 3, there is "a time to weep and a time to laugh, a time to mourn and time to dance".

When God formed the first human out of the clay, she was creating a playmate. When God rested on the seventh day, it was to take time to enjoy what was created on the other six days. Jesus is often found at banquets and feasts. In one gospel, we find him at a wedding celebration where he makes sure there is an abundance of wine. It is part of our nature as beings made in God's image that we are designed to play.

We can think of play as activity pursued for enjoyment or recreation. This includes sports, too. Closely related to sabbath practices, play includes moral activities that bring us pleasure. Taking time to play is an invitation to pause from productive obligations and habits and simply enjoy what we are doing. Play is an invitation to celebrate. Theologian Jurgen Moltmann describes play as a way of setting aside the day-to-day toil and decay of earthly existence. "Play relativizes our 'over-seriousness' toward life, filling us with a spirit of joy and delight that carries over into all aspects of our existence."

Play keeps us from taking ourselves too seriously. When we play, we remember to laugh and enjoy life. Playing keeps our minds and imaginations flexible and nimble for taking on the difficult challenges we face daily. When we take time to play together, we laugh and find delight in each other. How can you add playful experiences to your life? Explore all five of your senses. Find an excuse to indulge in play with children. Ask your grandchildren to play with you. Pick up an unfamiliar fruit in the produce section of the grocery store and experience the unfamiliar flavor. Color something with crayons, just for the fun of it.

Take some time off from productivity and play, and just for fun. You might even see God through the eyes of a child.

And we give thanks.



#### **Building and Grounds**


Last month, we talked about things to do inside your house as Fall was quickly approaching. Now Fall has arrived and some of us have experienced our first freeze of the year. The Building and Grounds Committee would now like to touch on some areas outside the house to be aware of.


Make sure to put faucet plugs on outdoor faucets now. We're referring to the easily installed plastic insulated covers that can be purchased from a hardware store and reused year after year. Check any areas around doors or windows where caulking may need to be reapplied or weather stripping around a door may need to be updated.

Finally if you have a fireplace make sure the chimney where the smoke vents out is free and clear of bird/squirrel nests, leaves, etc. A chimney sweep may also be a service to contact if you haven't had your chimney inspected in a while.

These activities, if completed by the time winter arrives in December, will save money on your heating bill or avoid costly repairs to your plumbing.
