The Outreach Team will meet sometime the first week or two of February. Depending on our "action plan for outreach," we anticipate meeting perhaps quarterly. As with all the Committees beginning this new and wonderful



year, we are looking and inviting any and all interested minds, bodies and souls to come work and help plan what this body of Christ will do this year.

This we already know -- we plan to continue our financial contributions to Grace Presbytery, Presbyterian Children's Home and Services, Rusk/Panola Children's Advocacy, Henderson Interchurch Ministry, Camp Gilmont and More Light. These are advocacies that we hold dear and they are already included in the current budget. In addition, we will continue to ask our members and friends to help support the annual Yates Park School Supply Drive, the monthly food drive drop off (first Sunday of every month), our Adopt-A-Block neighborhood care – which we try to do every other month --, and our volunteerism with Meals on Wheels every Friday. We are also hoping to implement one of our talked about Outreach programs called, **"Hustling Kindness."** Details on this fabulous program will be fine-tuned during our organizational meeting too. All activities that we as a church and as individuals do are generally more successful when we do them together. None of us can achieve alone what we can do as a community of believers and doers in and for our Lord. Whether you can contribute a little or a lot of time, you will be part of a really good thing. We hope to be the voice for those that may not be heard, the hand that helps someone up in troubled times, the smile that sends light into dark moments, a gentle glance that lets someone know they are not alone and a presence that shows the love of God and the compassion of humanity. Lenten Poem by Ann Weems


