

Safety Training

I recently attended a full day of ALICE Safety Training. It was sponsored by our presbytery and four trainers from Grace came together to provide an informative event. Our congregation was well-represented among the attendees. John T. helped facilitate and Lynn, Stefen, Jimmy and I attended.

No one wants to imagine bad or even unpleasant things happening at our church, but having a plan can avoid panic and save valuable seconds in an emergency. Safety in church is multifaceted. While our minds may jump to headline grabbing violent events, church safety also includes planning for severe weather, medical emergencies, fire safety, and being prepared for violent critical events. Safety includes having well-supplied first aid kits, knowing exit and escape routes, and planning rally points for gathering after evacuating the building.

We learned two useful acronyms. ALICE stands for Alert/Awareness, Lockdown, Inform, Counter, Evacuate. ALICE breaks down into two categories: Awareness and Communication, and Response Options. The second acronym we learned is OODA. In any situation, the human brain follows a particular pattern for decision making. This is the OODA loop. OODA stands for Observe, Orient, Decide, Act. For every new bit of information we observe, we must orient our perspective to take in the information, decide what we will do and then take action.

Our church has already implemented important measures. Moving forward, we will review those plans and procedures to keep ourselves informed and up to date. As individuals, we can do things to help each other. Learn the street address of the church. Sure, we all know how to get here on Sunday, but what if you had to tell a first responder where you were calling from? First Presbyterian Church of Henderson at 311 High Street on the Northeast corner of High Street and Fair Park.

It doesn't take much to be prepared, but a little planning today can help us take better care of each other tomorrow.


One Great Hour of Sharing special offering is in progress and will end at Easter. This offering helps so many people in so many ways. We encourage those that can to contribute to the offering.

The CE Team met to review books that have been given to the church for the library and to discuss our more limited role of participation in Vacation Bible School going forward.

In other business, as a church, we will celebrate Earth Day on **Earth Day April 22, 2023**. We hope you will join us in front of the church for a brief but beautiful celebration of God's Creation. We will invite our neighbors to celebrate with us. There is high hope that our new T-Shirts will be in for this event.

After Easter, the Sunday School class will start a Bible book study of Matthew, using N.T. Wright's guide from our library.

The CE Team also approved a request from Presbyterian churches (PCUSA) for our church to join with Mission Presbytery (Uvalde) to send a resolution to lawmakers urging the 2023 Texas Legislature to pass measures that ensure responsible gun ownership including: universal background checks, red flag laws, smaller magazine requirements, and raising the age for purchase of assault rifles. We believe that a majority of Texans currently support these common sense measures. On a motion from CE, the Session approved our church sending the resolution to members of the Texas Legislature including the Governor and Lt. Governor. We encourage any of you to please feel free to write individual letters to your legislators. Remember, too, to mark June 2nd on your calendar as National Gun Violence Awareness Day—and wear orange!!





Did you know that aluminum is indefinitely recyclable? Plastic and paper are downcycled, which means that they lose quality each time they are recycled. However, aluminum can be recycled over and over again, without losing quality. And the best part? Recycling aluminum consumes a lot less energy than producing new.

For example, it takes the same energy to produce one aluminum can than to produce 20 recycled ones! Recycling aluminum prevents the need to mine for ore to create new aluminum. It requires 4 tons of ore to create 1 ton of aluminum.

So remember, if you have an empty can in your hands, always recycle it!


