Worship at a Presbytery Meeting

On Saturday, Sept 23, I attended worship with 300+ people at the Grace Presbytery meeting at Preston Hollow Presbyterian Church. It was nice to be seated on the congregational side of the pulpit for a change. Worship included elements one might expect like prayer, song, preaching, and communion. But there were surprising elements as well.

The celebrants were pulled from Beyond the Walls ministers. These individuals found their calling to serve God in ways that take them outside the traditional boundaries of church, like hospital chaplaincy, Spiritual Directors, seminary professors, and family counseling. Even though the service was large, there were intentional moments that helped the service be intimate, lively, and welcoming. Some of the quiet intimate elements included the use of one-on-one prayer and personal blessing stations.

Our presbytery is in a time of transition and the first few months have challenged the new leadership. By utilizing the Beyond the Walls pastors to preside at this worship service, the service was both earthy and sacred. We acknowledged that we are in an uncomfortable stage of change. And we embraced that God is with us right where we are, where the rubber meets the road.

Music was sung in English, Duala (from Cameroon), Urdu (the national language of Pakistan), and led primarily by the choir from the First Presbyterian Church of Garland. Songs included a variety of drums, piccolo, organ, electric guitar, piano, and acapella voices. For the offering, the congregation was "invited to dance your offering down to the front with cheerful heart." More than one of the hymns is familiar to our congregation, "We Are Marching in the Light of God."

Being able to sing together, dance joyfully together, pray loudly together, and step discreetly to the side and pray intimately together created an environment that honored each one of us as significant parts of our interconnected whole. For this presbyterian pastor, it felt like reconnecting to some of the best parts of what it means to be the church.
