Worship Arts Theme: Remember You Are...

Theme Interpretation:

Lent is a time to remember who we are and who God is calling us to be. During worship this Lenten season, our songs and prayers will help reflect on our community life, what we release and let go of, and how we are rising into new ways of being. To help us pray, we will sing music from the Taize community, a Christian fraternity in France known for its inclusive and ecumenical spirit. Lent is a time to remember, to explore, and to prepare for new life. Remember, you are...



Worship Elements to Sing and Pray the Journey:

*Taize songs used as service music: Kyrie, Gloria, Prayer for Illumination, Postlude

*Community Prayer Refrain: "Fresh As the Morning" by Shirley Erena Murray This song will be a call to prayer and a congregational response for the prayers of the people each week. On Easter Sunday, the prayer response becomes the Sending Hymn as we sing the entire song together.

*Crafted Prayers of the People each week that reflect our journey together as a community (Worship Planning Team, others)

*Our Lenten Prayer Practice: "Remember You Are...a prayerful people."

(Lenten Prayer Station in Narthex beginning Ash Wednesday) What is a prayer you currently have for our community of faith? Write it down and leave it in the basket for the worship team to include during the prayers of the people each Sunday in Lent.

*Weekly Community Prayers of the People Focus: The planning team (+others) will put together the prayers of the people around the central theme of the Gospel reading for each week.

Worship Committee

A study by the University of Newcastle in Australia has found that on average, people ingest 5 grams of plastic every week, or 2000 microplastic particles. This is equivalent to eating a credit card every week.

Microplastic particles generally come from plastic gradually breaking down into small pieces in nature. They make their way into our rivers and ocean, and can be eaten by fish. However, microplastics have also been found in many everyday food and drinks, such as water, beer, shellfish or salt.

DID YOU KNOW?

People ingest 5 grams of plastic per week



It is the equivalent of eating a credit card every week!



Surprisingly, where we find the most microplastic is in drinking water. Every person consumes around 1769 microplastic particles every week just by drinking water. It is even more when drinking bottled water!

What can we do about it? The only way to reduce the amount of microplastics in the environment is to reduce the amount of plastic we use:

- Use a biodegradable bamboo toothbrush
- Say no to plastic straws
- Use soap bars for hand and body wash
- Carry a reusable bottle with your at all times
- Bring your reusable bag when shopping
- Bring you own cup when buying coffee

With Outreached Hands – We Reach Out


