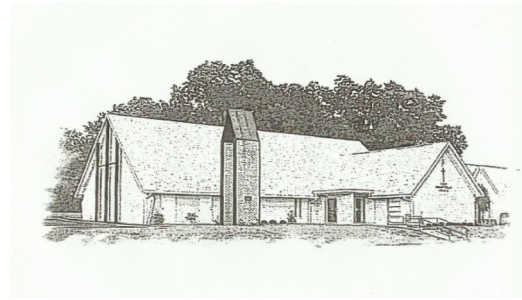

# DID YOU KNOW?

Students in the Philippines must plant 10 trees to graduate



This law allows 175 million trees to be planted each year

All high school and college students in the Philippines must plant at least 10 trees each year in order to graduate.

A law was passed by the Philippine Congress in 2019 to ensure that at least 175 million new trees are planted each year. The law was entitled the “Graduation Legacy for the Environment Act,” and proponents of the law saw it as an opportunity for the Filipino youth to help tackle climate change and build a greener environment for their generation.

The Philippines is one of the world’s most severely deforested countries with total forest cover dropping from 70% to just 20<sup>th</sup> century, mainly due to illegal logging. Lack of trees exacerbated the risk and impacts of floods and landslides.
