

BUILDING AND GROUNDS

Due to an accident unrelated to our church, involving Jose Diaz, our tree/limb/brush worker, the work on tree limbs on our side of fence line, landscape dig for better water drainage and gutter installment has been postponed for a couple of months. Please be in prayer for Jose's recovery.

The sloped concrete block outside sanctuary door entrance has been completed. Three generous church members made this happen. Easier access into the sanctuary from outside is now possible for our worshipers.

In August, John B. Hillin came to our aid and replaced ten sprinkler heads within the church yard's sprinkler system making the watering of the yard more efficient. Thank you for your time and effort, John, and for saving us funds for a service call.

Our committee is currently looking into a yearly service contract with Shawnee AC & Heating for servicing our units. More news on this will be coming in our October newsletter.

Our lone tree on the east side of our building has lost another limb. This tree, as you may remember, was given to our church many years ago in memory of John H. Hillin. It was originally planted on the west side yard by the bell tower but was dug up and replanted where it stands today. A few years ago it was struck by lightening and has suffered at least two lost limbs over the past few months. Clean up of both limbs was done out of pure kindness by Harriett Craig and crew from the City of Henderson's Park force. A letter was sent to the City of Henderson, attention to Harriett, thanking her for her crew's efforts in taking care of what needed to be done and saving us time and money. On a personal note, knowing the wit of the Hillin family over the years, I can just imagine the conversation that would have ensued between John H., Margaret and John B. on the plight of this Hillin tree. Great family, great memories.

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION—The Sunday School class is continuing its study of Appreciate These Things—8 Ways to Cultivate Compassion by Jill Duffield. We will finish this study sometime in September. Afterwards, we will begin the study of the book Making Sense of the Bible: Rediscovering the Power of Scripture Today by Reverend Adam Hamilton, who was the founding pastor of the United Methodist Church of the Resurrection in Kansas City. This church grew to have over 20,000 members. The book divides itself into two basic sections. The first is The Nature of Scripture. Chapters include topics like What the Bible is Not; Jesus and the Old Testament; Reading Someone Else's Letters; How, When, and Why the Gospels Were Written; Who Really Wrote Paul's Letters; Is the Bible Inspired?; and A High View of Scripture, in addition to several others. The second section is Making Sense of the Bible's Challenging Passages. Topics include Science, the Bible, and the Creation Stories; Were Adam and Eve Real People?; God's Violence in the Old Testament; Did Jesus Really Say That?; Women Need Not Apply; Making Sense of the Book of Revelation; and several others. This book is very easy to read, but it is also very thought-provoking. Please join us if you want to challenge yourself to think more deeply about the Bible.


