BUILDING AND GROUNDS

The gutter work has been completed on the north side of the sanctuary and the drainage issue has been addressed.

Chris, from CSC Seamless Gutter Service finished up all the gutter work with three downspouts and Tino Gonzalez built a rock berm and added two 4-inch tubing extensions neatly placed to carry water down and out the back. The ditch area in the back was dug out to aid water drainage. The committee is hopeful the gutter work and the rock/tubing, along with the existing T- post chicken wire and coverage engineering job done by members will be sufficient to fix our courtyard drainage issue. We think we are finally ready for the next torrential rain storm!

Since our last newsletter, several members have stepped up to make repairs and help with upkeep. With the discovery of a window in the pastor's study detached, the team of John and John formed a plan and repaired the problem within one day! Charlie, our resident weed killer, has been on the job keeping vegetation growth at bay in the newly cut back area and making sure all the window locks and latches are secure. The lock and deadbolt on the fellowship hall double door has been fixed and a faulty toilet that was using lots of water has been identified and repaired.

There is never a dull moment with FPC's building and grounds! Whew!
