The Finance Committee thanks you for your continuing monetary support for our congregation and the programs we support as a church.


We want to be transparent and be sure all members understand that we have been running an insufficient budget for several years. That means our expenses exceed our income and each year we transfer money from our savings account to our operating account, usually in an amount of around \$10,000 per year. Obviously, this is not infinitely sustainable.

Our current local savings account is approximately \$37,000. We also have money invested at the Texas Presbyterian Foundation, approximately \$40,000. We will draw on these accounts as needed in the years ahead. Please continue your monetary support and your prayers for our congregation and our light in this community.
