



Christmas is already more than a month in the past and Epiphany was several weeks ago. That means that the season of Lent will soon come before us. Ash Wednesday occurs on February 18, so that is when Lent officially begins. The season of Lent is a time of prayer, fasting, and self-examination in preparation for the celebration of the resurrection of Jesus at Easter. It is a period of 40 week-days; the Sundays in Lent are not counted in this reckoning of the time between Ash Wednesday and Easter, as every Lord's Day is a celebration of the resurrection. The 40 days in Lent remind us of the biblical stories also lasting 40 days—the flood of Genesis, Moses' sojourn on Mount Sinai as he received the 10 Commandments, Elijah's journey to Mount Horeb as he fled from the wrath of Queen Jezebel, Jonah's call to Ninevah to repent, and, especially, Jesus' time of testing in the wilderness. What we hear during Lent is that the way of the cross, the way to Easter, is through death. To appropriate the new life that is beyond the power of death means we must die with Christ who was raised for us. The church's peculiar Lenten claim is that in dying we live. In order to embrace the resurrection, we must experience the passion of Jesus. At the beginning of Lent, we are reminded that our possessions, our rulers, our empires, our projects, our families, and our lives do not last forever: “You are dust, and to dust you shall return.” The liturgies throughout Lent try to pry loose our fingers, one by one, from presumed securities and plunge us into unknown baptismal waters, waters that turn out to be not only our death tomb, but surprisingly our womb of life. Rather than falling back into nothingness, we fall back on everlasting arms.

The building and grounds team members are Kathy, Elizabeth, Charlie, John H., Steve and Tom.



With many responsibilities, our committee members keep busy and meet multiple times per month by telephone, text, face-to-face, and e-mail doing what they do best - "communicating."



SOUPER BOWL OF CARING FOOD DRIVE

What? The Souper Bowl of Caring is an annual national event that has a local impact. Through the Tackle Hunger organization, thousands of groups and communities utilize the Souper Bowl of Caring each year, using the energy surrounding football's biggest event of the year to generate support and donations for local food charities.

Why? The State of Texas has one of the highest food insecurity rates in America, with 16.4% of Texans suffering from some degree of food insecurity. Put simply, “Food insecurity is when people can't access the food they need to live their fullest lives.” (Feeding America). To put this into context, Rusk County alone (numbers as of 2022) has around 8,000 food insecure individuals. An even starker number is that about 24% of children in Rusk County are a part of that, without access to adequate, nutritious food. Food charities are constantly working to bridge that gap, giving both nonperishable food as well as produce to families in need.

How? The Souper Bowl of Caring (SBoC) is unique in that it takes place following the Christmas season. Thanksgiving and Christmas are often food charities' busiest times of the year, so the SBoC helps them be better able to restock and continue serving families throughout the winter. As a church partnering with Rusk County 4-H, we ask that you let us know how much food (in pounds) or money you end up donating to the food charity you already give to at other times so that it can be added to the national Tackle Hunger total. Collecting from **February 1st** until **February 15th** a display will be set up in the narthex for easy donation of items.

Our hope is that through this drive we will be able to help food charities help those in need. Imagine the impact we could have if everyone donated just \$1 or 1 can of food?

The book contains 7 Gospel stories of Jesus as he went from place to place. If the book title sounds familiar, last year at Lent we read *Meeting Jesus at the Table* by the same two authors. It was an excellent study.

My Lenten Practice

The season of Lent begins on Ash Wednesday and concludes with the celebration of Easter. These 40 days of preparation lead us to the death and resurrection of Jesus. It is a special time to grow in faith through practices of spiritual discipline, prayer, self-examination, and repentance. While these practices are part of our year-round Christian Walk, Lent is a good time to refine our discipline, adjust our techniques, or even try something new.


- Make a list of things, people, and experiences for which you are thankful. Add to it each day. Give prayerful thanks.
- Light a candle and meditate for five minutes each day on a word your spirit needs to hear right now. Maybe your star word, a name for God, or a phrase like “I am forgiven.”
- Go outside and don't take any pictures. Just appreciate the beauty of nature for yourself through your senses.
- Participate in the Lenten Sunday School class “Meeting Jesus on the Road” beginning February 22nd in the parlor.
- Invite a friend to worship on Sunday mornings.
- Pray the Jesus prayer daily several times a day using “Lord Jesus, Son of God, have mercy on me a sinner.” Then change the next day to, “Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God, have mercy on me your beloved child.”
- Do a traditional fast, like abstaining from meat, dessert, cola, or chocolate and donate the money saved to charity like HIM, or Rusk County Children's Advocacy.
